

To help my child at school, parents will:

Practise

- Help my child find a quiet place to practise their reading, phonics and spellings, multiplication tables
- Make sure my child has the right equipment in school every day. i.e. PE Kit, reading diary and reading book
- Read with my child at least 5 times a week, and sign their reading diary

Behaviour

- Encourage my child to care for school property, both at school and at home
- Behave in a way that sets a good example when I am on school premises
- Support the school in maintaining good, positive behaviour

Attendance and Punctuality

- Make sure that my child attends school daily and on time
- Ensure that my child is collected on time or inform the school if I am likely to be late
- Contact school promptly when my child is absent



Communication

- Make sure that school always has an up-to-date emergency contact number
- Let school know if there are any problems that may affect my child's welfare or ability to learn.
- Encourage a positive attitude towards my child's education and our school. If I have any concerns, I will come and discuss them with you as it is much healthier to work out solutions and move on
- Read all information sent home
- Engage with 'Earwig' on on-going timeline of my child's learning journey

Curriculum

- Encourage my child to participate fully in all school activities
- Support my child's learning by attending parents' meetings, open school and performances

School Uniform

- Ensure that my child comes to school properly equipped with a book bag and PE kit, and is dressed appropriately in school uniform
- Make sure that all items are clearly named

Social Media

- Monitor my child's use of the internet and social media. I will act as a positive role model and will use social media responsibly in all matters relating to the school
- Refrain from airing any grievances or concerns about the school on social media sites
- Use the existing complaints process if I have any concerns. This can be found on the school website in 'policies'
- Understand that inappropriate use of social media could result in the school taking action against the parent, including reporting to the police and legal action.



The school will:

Practise

- Check reading diaries, spellings and multiplication tables to reinforce the children's practise at home
- Offer interesting and suitable reading books and ensure that they are changed regularly



Behaviour

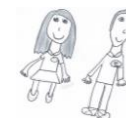
- Expect the best from children in their behaviour and work

Attendance and Punctuality

- Maintain accurate records of attendance

Communication

- Inform you about what your children will be learning each Assessment Period
- Communicate regularly with you about school matters, how your children are progressing and how you can support their learning at home
- Schedule regular opportunities for parents to engage with your children's learning
- Update 'Earwig' regularly so you can see and engage with your child's learning journey



Curriculum

- Offer a broad and balanced curriculum which meets and responds to the needs of the children
- Encourage children to do their best at all times
- Support your children in keeping safe on-line
- Set challenges in lessons that encourage children to be in the 'Learning Pit'
- Be clear with our success criteria so children know how to succeed

I will:

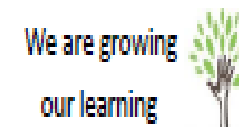
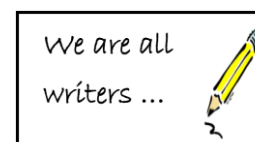
- Work hard and listen carefully to instructions
